Just wanted to write and say thank you for the introduction to 'Chapelstone Thirsty Bed'.

Whilst it is lovely being able to have my horses at home with me after 20 years I have had to seriously re-think my bedding strategy due to legal implications of who is licensed to take my muck heap away and the cost now involved. Long gone are the days when we were allowed to burn it or the farmer next door was happy to oblige. The average grab lorry will cost in excess of £180; a cost of which is on the rise every year.

Having both a mare and gelding who could 'wee for England', I have tried all sorts of bedding on today's market and have been so disappointed with the absorbency level and the effort required to muck out.

'Chapelstone Thirsty Bed' combined with the 'Thirsty Bed Fork' has been a revolution. At last, a lightweight tool that is designed specifically for the job. It now takes me no more than 10 minutes per stable. Cost wise as there is little waste it is extremely efficient and if there are days when the horse needs a little more bedding I can happily do so without worrying about my purse.

Before ordering my latest pallet of 'Thirstly Bed', I did try again with Wood Shavings as a comparison and almost cried every day with the time and cost involved of keeping a clean dry bed.

I am definitely a convert and happy in the fact that in pursuit of my own personal interest I am attempting to take some responsibility and do my bit for the environment. I would recommend this bedding to all other horse owners and urge them to give it a try.
